commitment of our board, staff, volunteers, and community partners.

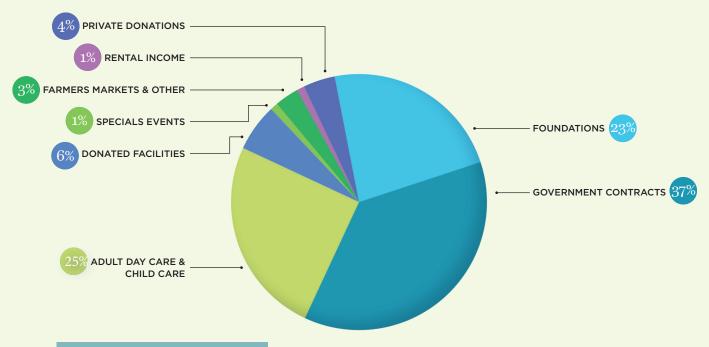

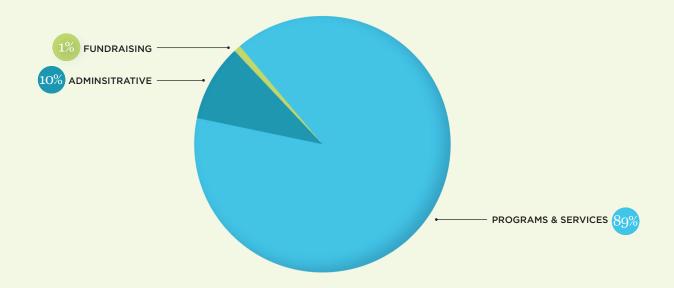
